



# Hua Hin Relaxed Holiday

5 Days / 4 Nights

#### Day 01: Arrive in Hua Hin

Pick up at the Bangkok airport or from your hotel in Bangkok, head to Hua Hin with a local English-speaking guide, and transfer to Hua Hin. On the way, visit *Maeklong Railway Market* (Hoop Rom Market). Commonly called Siang Tai, or Life-Risking Market, it is situated beside, and on top of, the actual train tracks. Seconds before the train was about to pull into Maeklong Station, the vendors rushed to pull back their parasols and umbrellas and clear their goods back to within inches of the passing train. Less than a minute after that, they have hurried to put everything back in place so they can get back to the job at hand, selling their seafood, fruits, meat, and vegetables to the local shoppers, and then transfer to Hua Hin to visit Wat Huay Mongkol, which has the largest statue of the Buddhist monk called "Luang Phor Thuad," who lived from 1582 to 1682. The holy monk is very well known in Southern Thailand for converting sea water to fresh water by foot. The last stop is one of the big highlights of the tour, a stop at Hua Hin Railway Station, a unique historical landmark with over 100 years of history and one of the oldest railway stations in Thailand. Lunch is at a local restaurant. Afterward, transfer to your hotel in Hua Hin, check in to your room, and the rest of the day is free for customers.

### Day 02: Sam Roi Yod National Park









Breakfast at the hotel. Today we go to Thailand's first coastal national park, *The Three Hundred Peaks*, which is a small but fascinating area of limestone mountains, coves, beaches, islands, and marshy wetlands, home to a great number of plants and some endangered animals. It is a wonderful and not too difficult place to explore. The main attractions of the national park are *Phraya Nakhon Cave*, with its iconic royal pavilion and huge chamber. It is easily accessible, only 60 km south of Hua Hin. The journey starts with a visit to a pineapple plantation field. After a continued drive to the park and travel pass by *Bang-Pu fishing village*, thriving fishing industry, and preparing for the day catch. Then take a boat from the boat station to *Phayanakorn Beach* [subject to sea conditions]. The only 20-minute boat ride concludes at a beautiful stretch of beach below the *Pra-Ya-Na-korn Cave*. Good walking shoes are recommended as you walk 430 meters up to the cave dome. Once inside, we can see the dripping stalagmites around the pavilion built by King Rama V. After lunch, we have time to relax and swim in the warm sea before going back to the hotel.
